

Our next NW-CERT meeting will be on Monday 20 January 2025. 3 pm -Retz Hall. It is always the 3rd Monday of the month. Everyone is always most welcome.

The National Sheriffs Association created the National Neighborhood Watch in 1972 to assist citizens and LE (law enforcement). In the aftermath of the terrorist attacks on 11 September 2001, strengthening and securing communities became more critical than ever. Since then, NW programs have responded to the challenge expanding beyond the traditional crime prevention role to help neighborhoods focus disaster preparedness, emergency response and terrorism awareness. Today the National NW recognizes Crime Watch, Business Watch and Neighborhood Watch.

The original purpose of NW was to increase awareness in communities about ways to protect homes from burglaries. NW volunteers focus on observation and awareness as a means of preventing crime. The benefits of a Neighborhood Watch reduce the risk of becoming a victim of crime. Participants are taught take preventive measures to substantially decrease the likelihood of becoming a crime victim by learning how to be better prepared and reduce the risks of home invasions, vandalism, personal assault and fraud.

schedules and when we are away, we feel more secure about our property. Being better prepared to respond to suspicious activity is the goal. When a resident falls victim to an attack on their home they feel vulnerable and usually do not recover their stolen property. The communication between community and the Police is critical. Rained Law Enforcement Officers should be the only ones to ever take action. Part of the NW is learning how to id and report suspicious activity and to provide the Police with the info they need to resolve the issue. Knowing your neighbors promotes getting to know their patterns. We also learn their activity and

Reducing fear of crime and making our area more livable is a plus and we also address fire safety etc. Reporting suspicious activity or a crime in progress..... The PD needs fast and accurate info about suspicious activity. Here is how you can help. Give the Harlingen or the Combes Police your name, address etc. Describe the event briefly and state concisely what happened and who did it. State if the crime is in progress or if it has already occurred. Describe the suspect's sex, race, age, height weight, beard or mustache and distinctive characteristics. Any weapons?

If there is a vehicle(s) involved, give a description - make, model, year, license plate, special markings, dents, and direction it went.
