
Hello SEPO Residents:

QUICK HISTORY of Rock Painting

*The Kindness Rocks Project was started in the US in 2015 by Megan Murphy on Cape Cod. Rock Painting was developed as a Kindness movement and several countries in addition to the US participate. Other countries participating include Australia, New Zealand, Canada, and the UK.

The rock club meets twice a month, the first and fourth Mondays of the month unless the day conflicts with a holiday. We meet from 1-3PM in the Hall.

Changes to the schedule will be communicated via Sunshine email distribution list and the resident Facebook page at Sunshine CCE residents.

The rock club also has its own Facebook page: SCCE "rockers".

Open to all community residents/renters, men and women, and immediate adult family members. Persons with no rock painting experience or art experience are encouraged to join the fun! It doesn't matter if you are artistic because we have books of ideas and tracing paper!

Our mission is to spread kindness by sharing rocks with others.

In order to cover the cost of rocks and painting supplies there is a charge of \$5 per session. If you want to paint rocks at home, we sell rocks at each meeting.

Lights On -- Lock Up and Look Out for each other!

Neighborhood Watch -- Community Emergency Response Team

Neighborhood Watch - building a safer community together. It's all about neighbors looking out for neighbors! NW programs promote community unity, bring neighbors together for a common goal all to enhance safety.

Sunshine CC Estates is the premier NW in our area. We formed after Hurricane Dolly's visit – having to deal with looting and such by the local Bad Guys. We are very proud of our relationship with the Harlingen and Combes Police Departments.

CERT - Community Emergency Response Team is a neighborhood-based team that receives special training to recognize, respond to and recover from disasters and emergencies. CERT skills also apply to daily emergencies.

CERT was created to help coordinate volunteer activities that will make our communities safer, stronger and better able to be prepared to respond to an emergency. The CERT Program educates volunteers about disaster preparedness for hazards that may occur where they live. We started our CERT Team following Hurricane Dolly in July 2008.

The program offers a consistent, nationwide approach to volunteer training and organization that professional responders rely on during disaster situations. This allows us to focus on more complex tasks. It provides opportunities for residents to participate in a range of measures to make their families, their homes and their communities safer from the threats of crime and disasters of all kinds.

FEMA works with State and local agencies to design training programs. "We are the help until the professional First Responders arrive"! We are the force multiplier – taking care of tasks such as checking on our residents, on our homes etc. following an evacuation and/or dangerous events on areas discovered. This helps the overworked professionals focus on more dangerous and critical tasks.

The history of CERT – it became a National program in 1993. Currently, all 50 states have a CERT program including many Tribal Nations and U.S. Territories. Each is unique to its community and all are essential to building a *culture of preparedness* in the United States. There are more than 3200 local CERT programs nationwide and more than 600,000 people have been trained since CERT became a national program.

CERT Training is designed to cover the following: Disaster Preparedness, Fire Safety, Disaster Medical Ops, assessment, treatment and hygiene, Light Search & Rescue, Team Organization, Disaster Psychology and Terrorism.

CERT Training promotes a partnering effort between emergency services and the people they serve. The goal is for Emergency personnel to train members of neighborhoods and communities or workplaces with basic response skills. CERT members are then integrated into the emergency response team capability for their area.





This is probably a 20-hour course including classroom and practical. There will be a fair number of "practical" lessons at the Fire House such as putting out a real fire, medical emergencies, rescuing a person under piles of debris, etc.. You will enjoy having an up-close exposure to the Fire House and learning how local emergency phone calls are handled.

Our class will handle 20 students. There is no fee. Since Darrell Loftus is teaching Firemen recruits currently, our program is next on the schedule (soon). Stand by for the date.

We can take 20 students for the 6 week (or so) program. You must attend all the classes. We will have one day a week assigned with location and lesson plans. Each class will be about 3 hours. A Sign-up sheet is in the Library.
